

How to go about setting up Community Protection teams for your neighbourhood Community

The first step is crucial and may be daunting as it requires personal, hard discussions with people you may not know. This is not something that should be forced in the conversation, as not all will be aware at all of how the growing situation in the USA has become dire. Utilize the facts and details of current events calmly and respectfully to present the need of why and how your community needs to come together, as together you are all stronger.

Some people you may not be able to convince.

(take note of these persons and ask for their cell phone number and give them yours in case they change their mind and so you can warn them if needs require it.)

#1 Go door to door in your community with printed out or hand written flyer calling for all able bodied persons, and interested persons to meet at a specific time and place within your community. *Use this first interaction to tally your communities population demographics as well as to assess each households willingness and capability to protect the community in the future.

COMMUNITY MEETING GUIDELINE

#2 Be prepared to explain in the community meeting the reality of the situation that your community needs to prepare for and the merits of sticking together rather than going it alone!

*24 hour surveillance is the best way to keep your community safe, and to accomplish this a community wide coordinated effort is the most efficient and holistic solution. Do this as calmly as possible as the meetings success depends upon a calm, logical, succinct outlay of the issues we could face, that, yes, will stress people who are not used to such topics, but need to know about it to survive.

3# Discuss any doubts any individuals have and assure that this is not about race or religious ethnicity but about protection for all. *Discuss in a talking stick kind of round robin manner, have each introduce themselves to each other, until all feel bonded and trust the intent behind the need for this. Most will be scared and will need to feel like they are being respected and heard as equals at this point!

(Once a trust is more or less established go onto step 4)

#4 Pass around a clip board for all to write down

- 1) the number of persons living in their house
- 2) names and ages of each
- 3) their address and
- 4) cell number
- 5) specific skill set of persons in the household
- 6) number or weapons and ammunition in each household
- 7) whether household has a generator and or Hamm radios
- 8) leave a blank space to record their individual Zello ID name later. (see below)

#5 Inform all smart phone or PC owners to sign up for Zello as your communities reliable communication method.

#6 Have a map of your community on hand in multiple copies if possible and discuss the specific logistics of how to cordon off your community so that all comings and goings can be monitored. Discuss any weak points regarding the specific layout of your community, have a person take notes on points brought up by community members on how to defend the community.

*Identify persons who can build barricades, tire spikes to go across road and yards. Employ as many persons as need be to have these built as soon as possible for all weak points, access roads into your community.

#8 Several level headed service to others personality persons should be voted in to be the leaders of each community watch, each of these persons will consult with one another and act as one if an emergency arises, as if something happens that requires a quick resolution time consulting the community is general may not be possible.

#9 Designate several suitable (interior located) safe houses in your community where children and the elderly can be amassed to ensure their safety if need be. These same houses should also have large stores of food, water, flashlights as well as first aid, medicines stockpiled in them. These stockpiles can be brought with the family members and or pooled. Move extra beds, bedding to these houses as needed.

*Identify persons in the community who have medical training and instruct them to be prepared go to these safe houses, as well as caregivers to prepare food.

*two persons at these safe houses must be designated secondary call centre persons to take turns to log all events that CPT members report to ensure community breeches and of suspicious persons are routed out either from within community or without. As well as to report safe house status and needs.

DETAILS OF PROTOCOLS BELOW CAN AND SHOULD BE MODIFIED AS PER THE COMMUNITY SPECIFIC NEEDS.

* Communications center, persons in your community who have Hamm radios should be identified and all networking with neighbouring communities and or trusted outside area contacts should be tasked to this Hamm radio operator to establish networks within and to neighbouring communities to warn of specify events as well as to maintain as well as within community communications to the various leaders, safe houses as need be.

*CPT should be in teams of 3-5 active at any one time, numbers of CPT teams may vary depending on the population of your community. The mobile, roaming teams should always to move in teams of 2 or more, and back up team/s available if need be on call at all times.

*Each CPT member will need a weapon, a cell phone, rope and or duct tape to detain. Pool weapons if need be so all on active protection team duty have a weapon.

*One armed CPT (team) should be at all times at ALL access points of your community, with vehicle blocking the road and any guard dogs if available.

*Mobile roaming CPT movement patterns should vary so they cannot be predictable and bypassed.

*All CPT team members need to have a communication device to report events as can be to communication centre persons, community leaders.

*Call centre person needs to record all details of events, patterns of issues protecting the community and report them to community leaders in timely fashion so they can be addressed based on priority.

*Leaders of the community select the individual CPT teams leader on active duty as per each teams individuals based on experience and level headed personality. A second in command should also be identified in each active CP team.

*Leaders select which teams are point, at the access points, if community population will allow and which teams maintain a mobile roaming security teams based on logistics and individual performance, abilities.

*Leaders as well as medically trained persons should pay attention to CPT teams status emotionally as well as physically and rotate out persons to ensure an effective, rested and fed team is on duty at all times.

*leaders will encourage CPT teams to not shoot to kill unless absolutely necessary, a knee wound to disarm person/s will suffice, duct tape and rope to immobilize and a secure garage or other building should be utilized to detain the individuals.
